SEED MIXES

EASTERN NATIVE HABITAT & CREP MIX

The eastern warm and cool season grasses and hardy forbs make an economical cover for large areas. Mix formulations are subject to change without notice depending on the availability of existing and new products. While the formula may change, the guiding philosophy and function of the mix will not.

Mix Composition:

- 35.5% *Elymus virginicus*, Madison-NY Ecotype (Virginia Wildrye, Madison-NY Ecotype)
- 33.2% *Andropogon gerardii*, 'Rountree' (Big Bluestem, 'Rountree')
- 18.8% *Panicum virgatum*, 'Habitat'-NJ Ecotype (Switchgrass, 'Habitat'-NJ Ecotype)
- 5.0% *Sorghastrum nutans*, PA Ecotype (Indiangrass, PA Ecotype)
- 2.7% *Chamaecrista fasciculata*, PA Ecotype (Partridge Pea, PA Ecotype)
- 1.8% *Echinacea purpurea* (Purple Coneflower)
- 1.8% *Rudbeckia hirta* (Blackeyed Susan)
- 0.9% *Heliopsis helianthoides*, PA Ecotype (Oxeye Sunflower, PA Ecotype)
- 0.1% *Asclepias syriaca*, PA Ecotype (Common Milkweed, PA Ecotype)
- 0.1% *Aster pilosus*, PA Ecotype (Heath Aster, PA Ecotype)
- 0.1% *Monarda fistulosa*, Fort Indiantown Gap-PA Ecotype (Wild Bergamot, Fort Indiantown Gap-PA Ecotype)

Seeding Rate: 11 lb per acre

LOW-GROWING WILDFLOWER & GRASS MIX

Specifically designed to provide erosion and sediment control and color on low-fertility sites. After the establishment year, this meadow mix may be mowed annually. This would preferably be in the spring prior to onset of new growth, but it may be after the meadow ceases blooming in the fall.

- 11.8% *Bouteloua curtipendula*, Butte (Sideoats Grama, Butte)
- 5.0% *Centaurea cyanus* (Bachelor's Button – Blue)
- 5.0% *Linum perenne* (Perennial Blue Flax)
- 1.5% *Coreopsis lanceolata* (Lanceleaf Coreopsis)
- 1.5% *Rudbeckia hirta* (Blackeyed Susan)
- 1.0% *Gaillardia aristata* (Perennial Gaillardia (Blanketflower))
- 1.0% *Gaillardia pulchella* (Annual Gaillardia (Indian Blanket))
- 0.9% *Chrysanthemum maximum* (Shasta Daisy)
- 0.7% *Aster oblongifolius*, PA Ecotype (Aromatic Aster, PA Ecotype)
- 0.7% *Zizia aurea*, PA Ecotype (Golden Alexanders, PA Ecotype)
- 0.5% *Cheiranthus allionii* (Wallflower)
- 0.4% *Pycnanthemum tenuifolium* (Narrowleaf Mountainmint)
- 0.3% *Papaver rhoeas*, Red (Corn Poppy, Red)
- 0.3% *Papaver rhoeas*, Shirley Mix (Corn Poppy, Shirley Mix)
- 0.2% *Agastache foeniculum* (Anise (Lavender) Hyssop)

2026 Fruit Tree Descriptions

Armstrong Conservation District

APPLE

Honeycrisp – Mostly orange-red fruit with yellow background. This crisp, juicy, sweet-tart apple has a rich flavor that has made it #1 in taste panels. Fruit averages 3 inches and up. Stores well. Outstanding winter hardiness. Moderately resistant to apple scab.

Liberty – A medium-sized, yellow-fleshed dessert apple with 90% red over yellow background color. Tree is vigorous and an annual bearer. Resistant to apple scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight and mildew. A good choice for the home gardener.

Mosaic™ – Scab-resistant variety. Long harvest window for the grower. Its elevated acidity and high sugar content make it a great snack apple. Lasts up to 6 months in regular cold storage.

RubyRush™ – Excellent resistance to fire blight and cedar apple rust. Also scab-resistant. The fruit is juicy and aromatic with a desirable crisp texture.

Triumph™ – Highly resistant to scab. Well-balanced flavor profile with a hint of tartness making this apple a standout. The fruit has a firm texture and stores up to 6 months in regular cold storage.

CHERRY

Benton® – **SELF-FERTILE**. Early to mid-season, dark red sweet cherry of excellent quality. Fruit is medium to large in size and more resistant to rain cracking than other varieties in this season.

PEACH

August Rose™ – Attractive late-season, white-fleshed peach. The freestone fruit is very firm and has a delicious melting texture. The tree is tolerant to bacterial leaf spot and constriction canker.

John Boy® – This peach has now claimed a prominent status as a commercial peach variety. Fruit is of very high quality and is large and very firm. The tree is vigorous and productive with good tolerance to bacterial leaf spot.

Julyprince – Fruit is large and highly colored with excellent firmness. The fruit develops color early but will hang on the tree for an additional 10 days to improve fruit size and flavor.

Loring – A large, firm, yellow-fleshed freestone with attractive red color over a yellow background color. An important commercial peach variety for many years. Considered to be one of the best canning and freezing varieties. The trees are vigorous, productive and have low susceptibility to bacterial spot.

PEAR

Beurre D'Anjou – A very high-quality pear ripening in late September. Fruit is light green and does not change from green to yellow upon maturity. A fine-textured pear, the flesh is mild and aromatic. Considered more blight resistant than Bartlett. Can be kept in cold storage until late spring.

Golden Russet Bosc – Fruit is long and uniform in shape. Flavor is similar to traditional Bosc, but harvests slightly earlier. Tree is vigorous.

Harrow Sweet – A late- season pear. Very good resistance to fire blight. Fruit size and appearance similar to Bartlett, however Harrow Sweet develops an attractive blush.

Seckel – A small pear with rich yellowish-brown skin when fully ripe. One of the best quality dessert pears. Tree is vigorous, hardy and productive. Ideal for the home garden.

PLUM

Bluebyrd – An excellent European-type plum for the commercial orchard and home garden use. The fruit is blue with amber flesh, medium to large in size with excellent flavor and high sugar content. The tree is vigorous and productive and has shown great resistance to black knot.

Stanley – A fine prune-type plum with excellent quality suited for both home use and processing. Fruit is large in size with dark blue skin. Flesh is greenish-yellow, juicy and fine-grained. The tree is early bearing and a good pollenizer for other European varieties.
